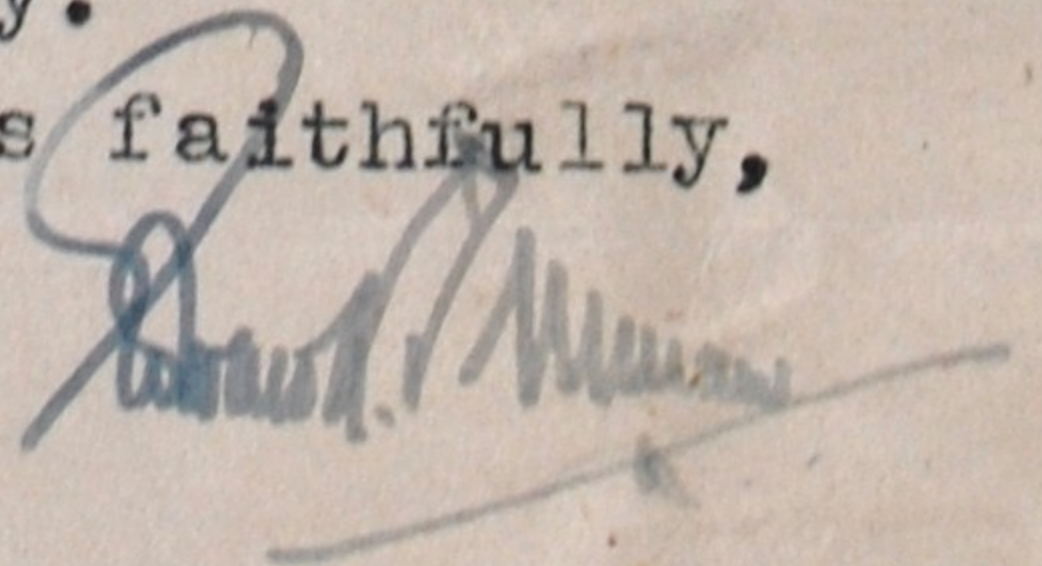

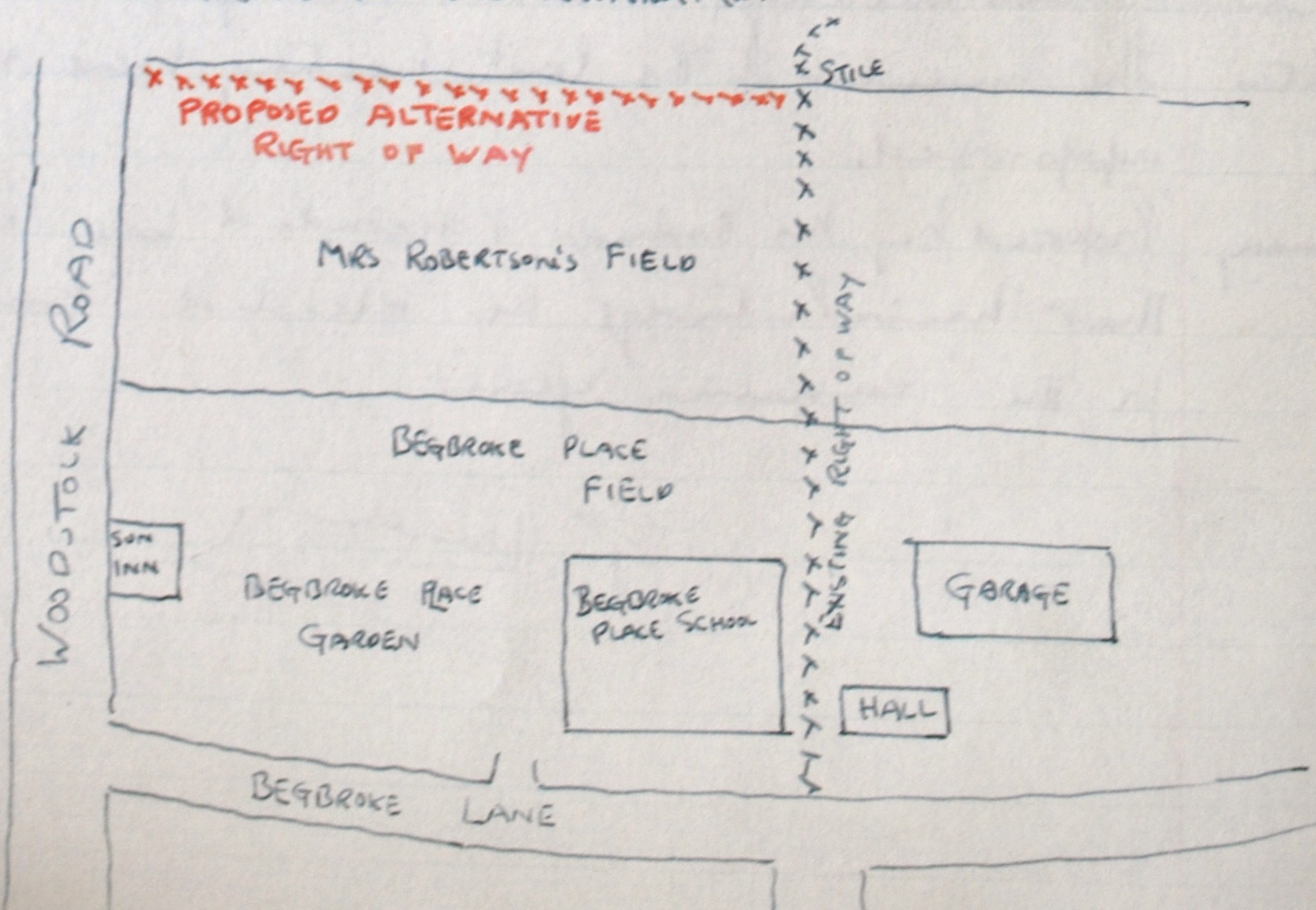

It was pointed out that Miss Partridge was not eligible
to act as Chairman as she was not a householder.

The meeting therefore resolved that the Parish representative
