Speed limit and school signs. The Rev. Mr. Carr informs

Sewage. Further complaints with regard to smells from the sewage disposal plant were received and the clerk was requested to get a further report from Chief Public Health Inspector, P. M. G. R. D. C.

Development of Begbrook Lane. The Council had before them a plan showing proposed developments in Begbrook Lane.

Post Box. The clerk was requested to ask the G.P.O. to repair the rough cast on the posting box near the village post office.

Timhill Road. The clerk was requested to draw the Divisional Surveyors attention to the repairs which were still required to the footpath in this road.

Minutes. The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

St Julianas Convent. The Council decided to take no action with regard to the overcrowding of buses at end of term at the present time.

Sewerage. The Clerk reported the receipt of a letter from the Chief Public Health Inspector, Bloughly R.D.C. stating the Convent Authorities had carried out all the work requested to the sewerage system. It was in perfect working order and there was a complete absence of nuisance at a recent inspection. Continued routine inspections would be made.

The Chairman reported the receipt of a letter from Mr Perry complaining of the stench and smell from the Convent drainage and the ditch leading to the old village.

In view of the report by the District Public Health Inspector it was

Resolved - That the matter be kept under observation during the next few terms.

Post Box. The Clerk reported the receipt of a letter from the GLC thanking the Council for their interest in the matter.

Sembell Road. It was reported that the repairs had now been completed both footpath in this road

Roadside Seats. It was decided that information should be obtained as to whether or not the roadside seats should be oiled. Regard would have to be had to the possible damage to people's clothes.

Village Hall Management Committee Resolved - That the Chairman's action in appointing his Assistant to the Village Hall Management Committee for one year from October, 1958, be confirmed.

Begbroke Lane. It was decided that if development takes place in Begbroke Lane arrangements should be made for any necessary street lighting to be installed at the expense of the developers.

Night Flying, Kidlington Airfield. The Clerk reported that short notice of a meeting to be held at The Town Hall, Oxford had been received in July dealing with night flying at Kidlington Airfield. Mr. Moore had attended the meeting and expressed the opinion that it would not be welcomed by the residents in the village. This had been confirmed in writing to the Ministry of Transport supporting Kidlington Parish Council's request for a Public Inquiry. Oxford City Council have now submitted an application to the Ministry of Transport for a variation of the licence to permit night flying. It was

Resolved - That the action taken be confirmed and the result of the protest to the Ministry awaited.

Village Playing Fields.

The Council had before them a letter from the Village Hall Management Committee regarding the possibility or otherwise of the maintenance of the Playing Fields becoming a charge on the rates. It was stated that the balance sheets of the Village Hall Committee had showed fairly consistent increases over the past few years, and it would be an expensive commitment for the Council to undertake. It was estimated that a penny rate would only produce £18. It was
