MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on 29th June 1978 were read by the clerk and confirmed as a true record.

MATTERS (i)

ARISING ON

THE MINUTES

It was reported that the Parish Council had been thanked for their observations on the two options for the Begbroke Roundabout scheme. These had been referred to the Department of Transport at Bedford to decide which of the two schemes should be prepared in detail. The Parish Council's reservation about the side road one-way system on Option 2 was accepted and from the preliminary examination it appeared possible to adapt the scheme layout so as to accommodate two-way traffic on all side roads. This will be investigated in detail if Option 2 is adopted. The County Surveyor and Engineer also thanked the Parish Council for their offer to approach the commercial enterprises on the A.34. but confirmed that negotiations had already commenced with them. Further information would be available when the Department of Transport's decision was known.

RESOLVED to note the report and to draw the County Surveyor and Engineer's attention to the question of the siting of the bus-stop and the real need for the bus shelter, and the question of the County Council meeting the cost of these works. It was noted that no approach had in fact been made to the commercial enterprise on the A.34. and that this matter be drawn to his attention.

(ii) RESOLVED To note that Mr. Douglas Hurd CBE. M.P. had also passed the Parish Council's letter about the A.34. onto the Minister

Mr. Horam and will let the Parish Council know when a reply is received.

- (iii) It was reported that the estimated cost of a notice board to be erected at the junction of Footpath N°6 with Begbroke Lane was approximately £25/£30. RESOLVED That an order be placed with the City Engineer for this notice board.
- (iv) It was reported that competitive prices had been received for the supply of a skip to the village. Curtis of Abingdon charged £13-30 plus VAT, Grundens £12-80 plus VAT as compared with M & M Transport's charge of £8 plus VAT. RESOLVED That the service with M & M Transport be continued and that on the next occasion the skip is provided it be sited on the Western side of the A.34. at either the Royal Sun or the school.
- (v) It was noted that the rubbish collection service provided by Cherwell District Council was still irregular and if this continued that the matter be taken up then and the local District Councillor.

PLANNING MATTERS

- (i) It was reported that Cherwell District Council had communicated with the Parish Council about the development of the Weed Research Organisation. The Area Planning Officer would be visiting the site in the near future to assess the impact of the development upon the village and the Organisation's plans for future expansion. An invitation was extended to the Parish Council to have a representative present at this meeting. RESOLVED To accept this invitation it being noted that a date for the meeting was still to be arranged.
- (ii) RESOLVED to note that planning permission was granted on 29/6/78 for the demolition of a conservatory and construction of an extension to the kitchen and dining room with utility room at 18, Woodstock Road East, Begbroke.
- (iii) RESOLVED to approve the planning applications in respect of the following proposals but in the case of the Weed Research Organisation to approve reluctantly subject to the site meeting referred to above:-

- (a) Mr. B. Hurvell, 40 Woodstock Road Extension to provide conservatory and cloakroom
- (b) Mr. C.G. Holmes 69 Fernhill Road Extension to enlarge kitchen
- (c) Need Research Organisation Temporary laboratory accommodation boiler house extension and new glasshouse

CORRESPONDENCE (i) RESOLVED to note the receipt of a letter from Southern Electricity announcing variations in the tariff for supplies of electricity.

(ii) RESOLVED to note the receipt of the Oxfordshire Transport Newsletter for July.

ACCOUNTS Two accounts for Southern Electricity were presented but held over for payment until the bank mandate had been obtained.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS (i) RESOLVED that a bank mandate form be obtained in respect of the new Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(ii) RESOLVED to note that planning permission for the Village Hall project was granted on 13th July 1978.

(iii) In connection with the casual vacancy RESOLVED that forms be obtained and the vacancy advertised. Further that a check be made upon the responsibility for meeting the costs of any election and whether an election must be held. This information then to be conveyed forthwith to the chairman.

MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on 10th August were read by the Clerk and confirmed as a true record.

MATTERS ARISING: Improvements to the A.34:-

ON THE MINUTES

a) It was reported that the County Surveyor and Engineer had been informed by the Regional Controller of the Department of Transport, that although he considered Option No 1 for the Begbroke Roundabout to be the best solution for trunk road traffic, he had appreciated that the Parish Council were concerned about extra traffic on local roads and he had therefore selected Option No 2 as the preferred scheme. Detailed design work on Option had now commenced.

b) All commercial enterprises on the A.34 have now been consulted about the proposals. It now appeared possible for the village bus-stop and bus-shelter to be retained in its existing location.

c) Copies of the notes of the meeting held on 28th June at the County Surveyor and Engineer's Department were circulated with the Agenda.

d) Mr. Douglas Hurd M.P. had forwarded a copy of a letter dated 16th August 1978 which he had received from Mr. Ernest Armstrong at the Department of the Environment. This confirmed that the proposals had been accepted by the Department of Transport and that detailed design work was being undertaken by the County Council. It also confirmed that careful consideration had been given to the proposed provisions of footbridges but that there was insufficient justification to treat these as special cases outside the normal criteria. Mr. Armstrong was pleased that the Parish Council were generally satisfied with the Department's proposals for improving road safety. RESOLVED that these reports be noted.

e) In regard to the Flashing amber lights on the A.34 it was reported that the County Surveyor and Engineer was still awaiting service details and quotations for a mains supply. RESOLVED that pressure be maintained for this work to be carried out.

ii) RESOLVED to note that the notice board to be erected at the junction of Footpath No 6 with Begbroke Lane had been ordered from the City Engineer and delivery was awaited.

iii) RESOLVED that for a trial period of three months arrangements be made for the provision of a skip for waste disposal to be sited at the junction of Begbroke Lane with Sandhill Road, the skip to be ordered for the last week-end in every month. It was noted that neither the Royal Sun or the School were prepared to have the skip on their

sites.

PLANNING MATTERS It was reported that Cherwell District Council had arranged a site meeting on 21st September 1978 at the Weed Research Organization which was called to discuss their future development plans. Mr. Day attended this meeting and reported that the agricultural buildings could be extended without too much difficulty with regard to Planning Permission. It appeared that this was the first time the Planning Officer had visited the site. It had been understood that a tree planting scheme would be implemented although short trees would probably be planted and W.R.O. were not too keen on trees as this affected the experiments. Nearby residents do not apparently want trees as this would restrict the view. There was a possibility though that specimen trees may be planted. Trees would also be planted on the A.34 road frontage but will take time to mature. It was noted that some of the buildings were in a deplorable condition. An assurance was given that chemical spraying was not harmful to the village and that adequate precautions were taken. It appeared that there was very little control over this type of research establishment. RESOLVED to note the report which was reasonably satisfactory and to give the benefit of doubt to W.R.O. at the present time but to keep the situation under review.

b) RESOLVED to note that planning permission had been sought for the following proposal, which was approved: -

Mr. & Mrs Waterhouse

Extension to form bedroom & toilet.

24, Woodstock Road

c) RESOLVED to note that Planning Permission had been granted in respect of the following: -

- (i) Mr. C. G. Holmes 69, Fernhill Road Extension to enlarge kitchen approved 21.8.78
- (ii) Mr. B. Hurrell 40, Woodstock Road Extensions comprising conservatory and cloakroom approved 26.7.78
- (iii) Begbroke Village Hall Management Committee Demolition of old pavilion and shed and replacement with brick built pavilion and store. Approved 13.7.78.

CORRESPONDENCE a) RESOLVED to note that the County Secretary had thanked the Parish Council for their comments on the proposals suggested for the closure of the Kidlington Out-Station for registration of births and deaths and that the office would continue to remain open in the future.

b) Personal Alarms - The clerk reported that the clerk to Cucklesdon and Denton Parish Council had provided details of these alarms. RESOLVED that the information be conveyed to the Rector.

c) RESOLVED to note the report appertaining to licensing control of Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles issued by Cherwell District Council.

d) RESOLVED to confirm the appointment of the clerk to 'The Link' Committee and that the next meeting was on 2ND November 1978 at 7.30 p.m. Dates for contributions to future editions of 'The Link' were noted as follows:-

e) RESOLVED to note that Mr. Leslie Wood was retiring in December after 31 years service with the Oxfordshire Association of Local Councils, but to take no action regarding a contribution towards his retirement presentation.

f) RESOLVED to note the contents of County Circular 4/78 for September details of which were presented to the meeting.

- b) Mr. Parker was subsequently nominated as the Parish Council's representative on the Village Hall Management Committee assuming he accepted his appointment on the Parish Council.
- c) RESOLVED to note that the Parish Council's accounts were audited on 15-8-78 with no adverse comment.
- d) RESOLVED that Mr. G. Day take up with the former Chairman Mr. J. Walker the latest position concerning the preparation of a tree planting scheme for the village.
- e) RESOLVED that the Chairman investigate with the Manager of the Midland Bank Ltd the position concerning the closure of the Deposit Account and the acquisition of a British Savings Bond.
- f) In regard to the communication received from the County Secretary about National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, section 31 re Oxford Canal Towpath, it was noted that further details were awaited from the British Waterways Board of their future intentions in the matter. RESOLVED that the matter be kept under review as necessary and that it be noted the County Secretary would be contacting Mr. R. Perry if the Board decided to proceed with the action.
- g) In regard to the 'link' editorial some discussion took place concerning the fact that Roman Catholics were not referred to under bereavements. It was suggested that perhaps a joint contribution from the Priory/School might solve the problem. RESOLVED that Miss B. Hayes be asked to advise on the matter.
- h) RESOLVED to note the receipt of the communication from Imperial Cancer Research and that this be referred to the Women Institute.
- i) RESOLVED that the clerk write to Mr. Willoughby, former clerk, concerning his letter sent to the former chairman earlier in the year.
- j) RESOLVED to note that the next C.S.E. meeting would be held on 8/11/78 at 6.00 pm and that the Chairman and Vice-Chairman would attend. Points for discussion to be raised at the next meeting.

MATTERS ARISING
ON THE MINUTES

- a) It was reported that there was no further news on the proposed
improvements to the A.34. RESOLVED to note the report and that
considerable surveying had been taking place.
- b) RESOLVED to note that details were still awaited from the County
Surveyor and Engineer regarding the connection of the flashing amber
lights to a mains supply and that he be pressed for a reply in the
matter.
- c) It was reported that delivery was awaited of the notice board from the
City Engineer to be erected at the junction of Footpath N° 6 with
Begbroke Lane. RESOLVED to note that the sign would be prepared
at the earliest opportunity and would be white lettering on a
blue background made of reinforced aluminium as vandal proof
as possible.
- d. RESOLVED to note that details of the proposed tree planting scheme
for the village was not yet available and to keep the matter under review.
- e. RESOLVED to note that the Midland Bank had not received the letter
of 4th July closing the Deposit Account and seeking the acquisition
of a British Savings Bond. In reconsidering the matter it was further
RESOLVED that a Building Society Account be opened with a
major Society such as the Nationwide or Alliance in the name
of the Parish Council and that this be dealt with by the chairman.
It was agreed that the Deposit Account be closed, the balance
transferred to the Current Account and a cheque for £1000 be

drawn to open the Building Society Account.

PLANNING a) RESOLVED to raise no objections to the proposed loft conversion
MATTERS to form two additional bedrooms and a playroom at 9, Sandhill Road, Begbroke occupied by Mr. & Mrs R. Sidhu.

b) RESOLVED to note that Planning Permission had been granted for the temporary laboratory accommodation, boiler house extension and new glasshouse at the Weed Research Organization.

CORRESPONDENCE c) It was reported that the time switch on lamp N°2 Willow Way had become faulty and that the SERB had recommended it be converted to a light cell for the sum of £22.37. In accordance with agreed policy it was RESOLVED that this be done.

d) It was noted that a News letter had been received from Oxfordshire County Council about tree planting and it was agreed that this be distributed to interested Councillors.

e) RESOLVED to note the contents of the Oxfordshire Association of Local Councils circular for October 1978.

f) It was reported that arrangements had been made for a waste disposal ship to be available at the junction of Begbroke Lane with Sandhill Road commencing 27th October 1978 and for the following two months. H&M Transport the company concerned had stated that if they are able to tip free at North Leigh the charge will be £8.00 plus V.A.T. but if a charge is made the cost will include a tipping rate of £3.00 per tonne. For example on average the ships hold two tonnes so the tipping rate would be £6.00 plus £8.00 making the price £14 plus V.A.T. The annual charge to the Council would be about £168. RESOLVED to note the information.

ACCOUNTS Two accounts from Southern Electricity were presented ie £30.01 for energy consumption and £19.75 for lighting maintenance. RESOLVED that payment of these be deferred pending a full report regarding previous payments and complications.

ANY OTHER a) It was reported that a local resident occupying 44 Fernhill Road
BUSINESS had suffered a nasty fall in Fernhill Road. She had attributed the fall to the uneven nature of the footpath. RESOLVED that as this was the County Council's liability the County Surveyor and Engineer be

asked to attend to the matter as soon as possible.

- b) A complaint had been received from a resident in Rowel Drive about the access which had been made in the hedge adjacent to his property. The informal access was frequently used by horse-riders and cyclists as well as pedestrians. The hedge did not belong to the Council. RESOLVED to accept the offer of Mr. Burt to have a word with Mr. Drexler about the need for repairs to the fence. In regard to the hole in the hedge on Footpath No 6 RESOLVED that this be referred to the County Council.
- c) It was reported that a wooden panel fence had recently been put up along Footpath No 6 which appeared to encroach on the pathway. RESOLVED that the matter be investigated by the clerk.
- d) In regard to the possibility of 'Personal Alarms' being supplied to old age pensioners RESOLVED that the matter be pursued with the Rector.
- e) Concern was expressed about the fact that there was no mention of an article in editions of 'The Link' from the Roman Catholic establishments in the village. RESOLVED that this matter be taken up at the next meeting of the Link Committee on 2nd November 1978.
- f) Mrs Shepherd of 71, Fernhill Road had complained about a blocked drain outside her property and the possibility of Flooding. RESOLVED that the matter be referred to the County Surveyor and Engineer.
- g) Concern had been expressed about what appeared to a ^{car repair} business being carried on at No 1 Foxglove Road. RESOLVED that the matter be referred to the Cherwell District Planning Department.
- h. RESOLVED to note that Mr. Day had been elected Chairman of the Village Hall Management Committee.

The minutes of the meeting held on 26th October 1978 were read by the Clerk and confirmed as a true record.

MATTERS ARISING
ON THE MINUTES

a) It was noted that further news on the proposed improvements to the A.34 was still awaited.

b) It was reported that the County Surveyor and Engineer had obtained a quote of £1,688.76 from the Electricity Board for connecting the flashing amber lights to a mains supply, but he had no funds available to carry out the work. The Parish Council were asked to consider meeting the cost perhaps in conjunction with the school. RESOLVED - that this be deferred as it would mean an additional rate precept being levied.

c) RESOLVED to note that the sign to be erected at the junction of Begbroke Lane with Footpath No 6 was still awaited from the City Engineer.

d) It was noted that details of the tree planting scheme for the village were awaited. RESOLVED that the offer of Mr. G. Day to discuss the matter with Mr. Walker be accepted.

e) RESOLVED to note that the deposit account had been closed, the funds transferred to the current account in the sum of £548.77 and a Building Society Account with the Nationwide opened in the sum of £1000.

f) RESOLVED to note that no further news had been received from Mr. W. T. Willoughby, former clerk, concerning the question of the cheque sent to him in March 1977. It was agreed that this matter should be kept under review.

g) It was RESOLVED that the urgent attention of the Cherwell District Council be drawn to the fact that No 1 Foxglove Road was apparently being used as a spares agency for American cars.

PLANNING
MATTERS

h) RESOLVED to note that planning permission was granted on 9th November 1978 for the loft conversion into a bedroom at 64,

Fernhill Road, Begbroke

b) Mr. P.T. Seall

Extension to form new kitchen and lounge and also new garage at 'The Place' 4, Woodstock Road, Begbroke

RESOLVED to approve the application with the recommendation that the applicant meet the cost of installing a sliding glass door between the kitchen and dining room of No 6 Woodstock Road in view of the anticipated loss of light in this dining room.

c) Hamilton Richard

Erection of single storey dwelling (outline) on land at Orchard House St. Michael's Lane.

RESOLVED to make no observations upon the application but the views of the planners be obtained with regard to future planning policy for the old part of the village. Careful consideration to the detailed plans would be given in due course to ensure that the building was in keeping with the character of the local environment. It was noted local residents would be objecting to the proposal.

d) It was reported that development was taking place at No 28 Begbroke Lane which had not received either planning permission or building regulation approval. The development appeared to consist of an extension to the dining room. Adjacent neighbours were concerned about the extent of this unpermitted development and had complained about it. In addition there appeared to be a car repair business being conducted at the premises. RESOLVED that as Cherwell District Council did not appear to have yet investigated the matter they be asked to take appropriate action with the utmost speed.

CORRESPONDENCE a) It was noted that the preliminary draft of the public transport plan would shortly be sent by the County Council and that views would be required by 31st January 1979.

b) RESOLVED to note the receipt of a map and explanatory note from the County Surveyor and Engineer about the routes to be salted in Oxfordshire in times of Frost which would be displayed on the notice-board.

c) It was RESOLVED to note that after consultation with the chairman

and Vice-Chairman a bid had been made for ten trees, either limes or oaks which had been offered by the County Council free of charge, with a preference stated for oaks.

d) It was noted that the O.R.C.C. had sent an invitation for a representative to attend the Annual General Meeting on 24th November to collect a certificate on behalf of the village as a runner-up in the 1978 Best kept Village competition. Unfortunately the Parish Council had been unable to send a representative and it was presumed that the certificate would follow in the post.

e) Details of the Oxfordshire Association of Local Councils meeting to be held on 12/12/78 were received and noted

f) Parish Councillors were supplied with a copy of the Report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, as previously requested.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

a) RESOLVED to note that the Parish Precept on Cherwell District Council had been credited to the Current Account in the sum of £2,025. Following the closure of the Deposit Account, the Current Account now stood at £2112.50 and the new Building Society Account at £1000+.

(c) In regard to payments made to the S.E.B. a summary of payments made over the last three years was presented a copy of which is appended to these minutes. It was noted that Holton Parish Council had ^{also} paid Begbroke Parish Council's account for the same period in the sum of £30.01 in error. RESOLVED that the two respective invoices be exchanged

BUSINESS

- a) It was reported that at 'The Link' Committee meeting on 2/11/78 the question of a possible contribution from the Roman Catholic establishments in the village was raised. It was understood that numerous attempts had been made in the past to obtain such a contribution without success and the suggestion had been made that the Parish Council may wish to pursue the matter. RESOLVED to note the report and also that the Village Hall Management Committee may have achieved some success in this direction. It was therefore agreed to defer this to the next meeting.
- b) It was reported that a complaint had been received from N°62 Fernhill Road about the fact that the footpath along Rowel Brook had been ploughed up and sprayed with an obnoxious substance. RESOLVED to note that the question of the reinstatement of this footpath had been taken up with the farmer.
- c) RESOLVED to note that the footpaths in Fernhill Road and along the service road had been patch repaired by the County Surveyor. The question of the blocked drain in Fernhill Road was still being investigated.
- d) On the question of 'personal alarms' for old-age pensioners in the Village it was RESOLVED that the availability of these be displayed on the notice-board and in the Village Hall/Post Office as agreed with the Rector.
- e) The erection of the wooden panel fence at the lower end of Footpath N°6 was discussed and it was RESOLVED that this matter be taken up with Chesham District Council as a matter of urgency.
- f) It was noted that the Village Hall Management Committee had accepted a recommendation from the Fete Committee namely that part of the profits from the Village Fete be utilised to acquire a child's safety ring at a cost of £140 and the Parish Council were asked if they would be willing to contribute towards this cost. RESOLVED that a contribution of £70 be made towards the cost.
