Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for Oxfordshire
Kidlington Footpath No. 37 Modification Order 2024**

The above Order made on the 2 September 2024, if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by: -

Adding to them the public footpath from Footpath No. 33 (the Oxford Canal towing path) at grid reference SP 4872 1350 running northeast over the canal bridge for 18 metres to the metalled footpath recorded on the List of Streets to the rear of 35 Osbourne Close at SP 4873 1351.

If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
